Greetings Elmwood Community,



1. Mrs. Hoffman's 3rd Grade had another mystery reader. This time it was one of our bus drivers, Victoria Riddle who volunteered. It is great to see all our staff willing to assist in helping stress the importance of reading.



2. Elmwood 5th graders participated in a "living" wax museum on Friday, March 1st in the community center gymnasium. Students chose an inspirational person to read a biography, complete a trifold board, and write a speech reflecting that person's life, challenges, and accomplishments. Students dressed in character and recited their speeches to community members and Elmwood 3rd graders. The students learned many important skills with the project such as; learning to read a biography, researching information from multiple sources, writing a speech, completing a timeline, and practicing their public speaking skills. We are so proud of our 5th graders!



3. On March 20th, international students attending the University of Findlay visited Elmwood 7th graders and shared cultural experiences related to their home countries of Japan, Korea, and Vietnam. The visit allowed for students to compare differences between their middle school experience with those of students in these East Asian countries. Madison Laird described that, "The difference is most schools in the U.S. don't have to wear uniforms, but Korean, Japanese, and Vietnamese students all have to wear uniforms. For example, Vietnamese students have to wear a white shirt and a red bow tie." When describing the Japanese practice of students cleaning classrooms, Michelle Gallagher mentioned how, "At their school, they take responsibility, and after lunch, students have to clean up any mess they made. In our culture, we have janitors and don't clean the school at the end." Even though many differences exist, students were also able to find some similarities between cultures. As Hunter Motot mentioned, "Here in America, we have some similar club activities such as using instruments, baseball, basketball, etc."

Ivanna Gutierrez noticed some similarities in the attire of students, explaining, "On their uniform sweaters/jackets, they have their school's logo. This is like us because we have varsity jackets with our school logo!" Finally, students could also compare differences in culture between teenagers in Korea, Japan, and Vietnam. Harper Davis noticed differences within a typical school day for students, writing, "The school time in Korea is from 9:00 AM to around 4:00 PM, and in Japan it is from 8:00 AM to 6:30 PM. In Vietnam it is from 6:45 AM to 9:30 PM." This visit was made possible through the Department of Language and Culture at The University of Findlay.



4. On March 11th, Elmwood's Pre-Kindergarten program was awarded 5 stars for Ohio's Step up to Quality Program.
