# ELMWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION March 13, 2023

WHEREAS, the Board of Education desires to renew its existing one-half percent (0.50%) School District income tax.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Elmwood Local School District (the "School District"):

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 5748.02 of the Ohio Revised Code as enacted in Substitute Senate Bill 28 of the 118th General Assembly (the "Act"), and as amended, it is necessary to raise \$902,950 for School District purposes (as defined in the Act). The income that is to be subject to the tax is taxable income of individuals and estates as defined in divisions E(1)(a) and (2) of Section 5748.01 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 2. 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## ELMWOOD LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT INTER-DISTRICT OPEN ENROLLMENT GUIDELINES The Elmwood Board of Education will participate in an Inter-district Open Enrollment Program as prescribed by Senate Bill 140 and the Ohio Department of Education Rule 301-48-02. This program shall be in effect for the present school year and shall include all

districts in the State of Ohio. Guidelines for an inter-district student transfer into the Elmwood Local School District are based on the criteria established by the

Elmwood Board of Education. These guidelines are consistent with Ohio Revised Code 3319-98.

- Any application for inter-district student transfer must be submitted to the superintendent's office in the student's district of residence. A copy of that application must also be sent to the superintendent's office at the Birnwood Local Schools between May 1 (beginning at 8:00 a.m.) or the first subsequent business day thereafter through May 31 (ending at 4:00 p.m.) or the prior business day before. Applications will be considered on a first-come, first serve basis with the assurance that Elmwood residents will not be displaced. Applications will be acted on by the Superintendent of Schools the week prior to school starting (usually the third week of August). Parents of students requesting enrollment into the Bimwood Local Schools must indicate acceptance of transfer or the acceptance may be void
- A separate application must be submitted for each student who would like to be considered for inter-district open enrollment. The application process must be repeated each school year.
- All approved transfers are in effect for the present school year only, and may be discontinued at the discretion of the Elmwood Board of Education in subsequent years.
- No interdistrict transfer will be permitted if the enrollment of a grade level being requested exceeds the following:

Grade	School	Enrollment Limit
K-2	All Blementary Schools	Average 20 students per homeroom (80 students per grade level)
3-5	All Elementary Schools	Average 23 students per homeroom (92 students per grade level)
6-8	Middle School	Average 25 students per section in the core area subjects of social studies, mathematics, science, English
9-12	High School	Average 25 students per section in the core area subjects of social studies, mathematics, science, English

- No student accepted by the Elmwood Local Schools will be displaced should enrollment exceed the limits established in guideline D during the year of acceptance.
- The Elmwood Local Schools will not be required to institute any special needs programs, either low or high incidence, to serve potential transfer students. If a student is evaluated for special needs placement after he/she is accepted as an inter-district transfer student, representatives from the district of residence will be invited to participate in all evaluation team and placement meetings. The sending or home school district is ultimately responsible for ensuring that the special needs student is appropriately served in accordance with local, state, and federal mandates.
- When student enrollment has reached or exceeded 80% of capacity in district special needs programs, a qualifying student from another district will not be considered for an inter-district transfer request.
- Applicants may be rejected if the racial balance of either the sending or receiving district would be negatively impacted.
- The Elmwood Local School District will not accept responsibility for transportation of students from other school districts, unless deemed practical by the superintendent of schools.
- The Elmwood Local School District may deny enrollment to students who have been suspended or expelled for ten or more consecutive days in a current term, or the immediately preceding term.
- K. When a student wishes to attend the joint vocational school (Penta) serving the receiving district (Elmwood), the administration of the joint vocational school shall be contacted to ascertain the availability of the desired program before enrollment is granted.
- Ohio Athletic Association Eligibility Guidelines will be in effect for all inter-district open enrollment students.
- Preference will be given to those students and their families who were accepted during the previous school year.
- Students who reside in the Elmwood School District and move from the district during the course of the school year may apply to remain at Elmwood for the remainder of the current school year. Application will have to be made for the next school year to continue as open enrollment.

## MASTER SERVICES AGREEMENT

## between Specialized Education of Ohio, Inc. and Elmwood Local Schools for RSY & ESY of 2023-2024 at High Road School of Findlay

This Master Service Agreement is dated March 6th, 2023 ("Effective Date"), between Specialized Education of Ohio, Inc. ("SESI") that owns and operates High Road School of Findlay, an approved nonpublic, private special education school in Ohio and Elmwood Local Schools, 7650 Jerry City Rd., Elmwood, Ohio, 44817, United States (referred to herein as "District," even in instances where the counterparty refers to itself as "Board") ("Agreement").

WHEREAS, SESI owns and operates High Road School of Findlay that serves students with a wide range of special education classifications, primarily students with emotional disabilities and students with multiple disabilities (the "School"); and

WHEREAS, the District desires to refer District students to the School whose Individualized Education Plan ("IEP") have identified the Program as an appropriate placement (each a "Student"); and

WHEREAS, this parties have agreed to enter into a master set of terms and conditions that will govern the Services (defined below) as outlined in each student enrollment form.

## WITNESSETH

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- Services. The District may from time to time refer students to be enrolled in the School (hereinafter
  referred to as "Student" or "Students") as set forth on the Student-specific enrollment form and the
  Students' IBP (collectively the "Services"). The enrollment form will set forth the tuition and related
  services fees for each Student, in accordance with Schedule 1, Fee Schedule, attached to this
  Agreement ("Enrollment Form").
- 2. Term and Termination. The term of this Agreement will begin on the March 6th, 2023 and end on the July 31st, 2023 unless otherwise extended in writing by the parties ("Term"). Either party, upon fifteen (15) days written notification to the other party, may terminate this Agreement or a Student Enrollment Form at any time. Upon termination, SESI will charge Tuition up to and including the date of Student withdrawal from the School.
- 3. <u>Distance Learning.</u> When due to government mandated closures or unforeseen circumstances that prevent SBSI from conducting in-person classes, SBSI may deliver the Services, in whole or in part, via distance learning to the extent practicable, using programs, systems, teaching techniques, diagnostic tests, evaluation, academic courses and materials adapted for distance learning at the level of service reasonably practical under the same circumstances, at the fees, rates and payment schedules as set forth in this Agreement.

- 4. General Supervision of Services. The District or its designated representatives shall have the right to general supervision of the Services, the right to approve such Services and the right to make changes to the Services in accordance with the terms of a Student's IEP. SESI will maintain records of the Services provided to the Students, invoices issued to the District and payments made to SESI during the term of this Agreement. Such records shall be consistent with any guidance or standards developed by the Department of Education. SESI shall allow the District or the Ohio Department of Education to conduct announced and unannounced site visits and to review all documents relating to the provision of special education services to the Students during hours that are least disruptive to the daily operation of the School.
- 5. Fee. In consideration of the Services to be provided by SESI, the District will pay SESI the fees set forth on each Enrollment Form (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Tuition"). The Student-specific Services listed in each Enrollment Form are pursuant to each Student's IEP. If the referred Student's IEP requirements are changed during the Term, the Services and Tuition, as described in the Enrollment Form, will change and will be automatically incorporated into such Student Enrollment Form upon approval of the revised Student IEP, by the District and Student parent/guardian.
- 6. Invoicing and Payment. SESI will invoice the District monthly for Tuition by the 15th day of the following month in which Services were provided. All invoices are due and payable within thirty (30) days of receipt. The District agrees to pay SESI the Tuition during the Term regardless of the actual attendance of the Student.

During the 2022-2023 School Year, the District agrees to pay Provider a monthly education fee in accordance with the scheduled contained on the Enrollment Form for each student ("Tuition"). The-eost for monthly Tuition will be as follows:

- a. \$3,245.50 for each month or part of a month a student is enrolled in an Academic Model classroom,
- 7. Compliance with Applicable Laws. SESI represents it complies with applicable laws and regulations governing the Services including student privacy laws including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99). The School is non-public and maintains licenses and certifications as required by Ohio law. SESI employees have the requisite skill, expertise and knowledge necessary to perform the Services required under the terms of this Agreement.
- 8. <u>Background checks.</u> SESI employees who are assigned to perform the Services meet the hiring requirements for school-based employees as required by applicable state laws and regulation.
- Student Progress Reports. SESI shall make available to the District or its representatives those
  progress and evaluative reports upon request or as required by a Student's IEP.
- 10. Force Majeure. Neither party will be liable to the other party hereunder or in default under this Agreement for failures of performance resulting from acts or events beyond the reasonable control of such party, including, by way of example and not limitation, acts of God, disease outbreak or widespread illness, electronic computer virus, civil disturbances, war, and strike.
- 11. Indemnification and Limitation of Liability. To the extent permitted under law:

Any party may designate a different address by giving the other party thirty (30) days prior written notice in the manner provided above.

- 15. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed, interpreted, and governed by the laws of Ohio.
- 16. <u>Student Lunch.</u> When the District has an enrolled student in an out-of-District placement, the District remains responsible for ensuring that lunches are available to the student even if the approved special education school does not participate in the National School Lunch Program. The same principle of access to meals applies if a student with disabilities would have been eligible to participate in a school breakfast program at the school the student would have attended if the student had not been placed out-of-District. Documentation related to free or reduced-price meal benefits, including meal benefit applications, must be maintained by the District or approved private special education school claiming meal reimbursement. Approved private special education schools and collaboratives will review the free and reduced lunch student list with the District annually including the availability of meals to students who are publicly funded and placed at their facilities. If a school does not provide access to meals, approved special education school or collaborative leaders must contact the District to discuss arrangements that may be made to meet their mutual responsibility.
- 17. <u>Independent Contractor.</u> The relationship between the District and SESI shall be that of principal to independent contractor, and the employees of one shall not be deemed employees of the other for any purpose whatsoever. Each party shall maintain during the term of this Agreement such disability and worker's compensation insurance for its respective employees and staff as is required by law. Each party shall indemnify and hold harmless the other against any claim or demand made by employees or staff of the indemnifying party against the other based on rights or privileges applicable to employees of the other. Each party shall be solely responsible for the hiring, training, and termination of its own employees and contractors.
- 18. Entire Agreement. This Agreement includes all exhibits, schedules, attachments attached hereto as well as duly executed Student Enrollment Form(s) incorporated herein by reference. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous oral and written agreements and statements, all of which have been fully integrated herein. This Agreement also supersedes any course of conduct, performance or dealing between the parties. No amendment or modification changing this Agreement's scope or terms shall have any force or effect unless executed and delivered in writing and signed by all parties.

- a. District agrees to indemnify SESI and its officers, directors and employees ("SESI Indemnitees") against and from Claims (defined below) asserted by third parties for direct costs, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees), damages, injury or loss ("SESI Losses") to which SESI may be subjected by reason of gross negligence or willful misconduct of District, its officers, directors or employees; provided however, SESI Indemnitees may not seek indemnification from District for any SESI Losses caused, in whole or in part, by the acts or omissions of SESI, its officers, directors and employees;
- b. SESI agrees to indemnify District and its officers, directors and employees ("District Indemnitees") against and from Claims (defined below) asserted by third parties for direct costs, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees), damages, injury or loss ("District Losses") to which District may be subjected by reason of gross negligence or willful misconduct of SESI, its officers, directors or employees; provided however, District Indemnitees may not seek indemnification from SESI for any District Losses caused, in whole or in part, by the acts or omissions of the District, its officers, directors and employees.
- c. Claims. If a claim for indemnification (a "Claim") is to be made by a party entitled to indemnification hereunder against the indemnifying party, the party claiming such indemnification shall give written notice (a "Claim Notice") to the indemnifying party as soon as practicable after the party entitled to indemnification becomes aware of any fact, condition or event which may give rise to damages for which indemnification may be sought under this Section. Such Claim Notice shall specify the nature and amount of the Claim asserted, if actually known to the party entitled to indemnification hereunder. Subject to the limitations of this Section, the failure of any indemnified party to give timely notice hereunder shall not affect rights to indemnification hereunder, except to the extent that the indemnifying party demonstrates actual damage caused by such failure.
- d. Notwithstanding any other provision, the total liability of SESI for all claims under this Agreement is limited to the total amount of fees paid to SESI under this Agreement. Neither SESI nor the District shall in any event be liable for any indirect, consequential, or punitive damages, even if SESI or District have been advised of the possibility of such damages.
- 12. <u>Disputes and Investigations</u>. In the event that any action, suit, proceeding or investigation relating to this Agreement is commenced, the parties hereto agree to immediately notify each other in writing of the pending action, suit, proceeding or investigation, and to cooperate to the extent possible to defend against and respond thereto and make available to each other such personnel, witnesses, books, records, documents or other information within its control that are reasonably necessary or appropriate for such defense. In the event any dispute arises out of this Agreement, the parties will seek to resolve the dispute as expeditiously as possible. Except as may be set forth herein, the interests of the referred Student shall be of the foremost concern in resolving such disputes.
- 13. <u>Assignment.</u> No assignment of this Agreement or of any duty or obligation or performance or payment hereunder, shall be made by either party, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, except that SESI may assign this Agreement or any duty or obligation or performance or payment hereunder to a subsidiary or affiliate of SESI or any entity acquiring all or substantially all of the stock, equity or assets of SESI.
