

College Credit Plus- Intent to Participate Form

Elmwood High School

This form must be signed and returned to the High School Guidance Office by April 1, 2021 in order to participate in the CCP program for the 2021-2022 school year.

I have received a copy of the Elmwood CCP informational packet and understand the advantages, possible risks, and consequences of participating in this program. The packet included, but is not limited to the following:

- The program is open to students in grades 7-12. Students may enroll in a maximum of 120 semester hours of college credit.
- If accepted by an eligible postsecondary institution, students may enroll in non-religious and non-remedial courses.
- Students must choose Option A or Option B at the time of enrollment. Once Option A or B has been chosen, the decision is final and may not be changed.
 - If the student chooses Option A, the student **is responsible** for the cost of tuition, books, materials, and other expenses.
 - If the student chooses Option B, the student **is not responsible** for the cost of tuition, fees, textbooks, and materials for courses successfully completed through a public post-secondary institution. Private postsecondary institutions may charge the student a fee per credit hour for courses taken, which the student is responsible for paying. Students qualifying for the Free/Reduced Lunch Program may not be charged by the private postsecondary institution. Remedial and religious courses do not qualify.
- Students are required to provide their own transportation and pay for any related expenses such as parking passes.
- Students will receive college credit at the postsecondary institution they attend. If the student decided to enroll in another post secondary institution after high school graduation, the student must submit a request to the original instantiation to transfer the credits via an official transcript.
- Students may attend a postsecondary institution either full time or part time and may enroll in multiple institutions.
- If a student qualifies for the Free/Reduced Lunch Program, the student may apply to be reimbursed for transportation, according to the guidelines and formula established by the State Board of Education.
- For college courses converted to high school credit, the grades earned at the post secondary institution will be factored into the cumulative GPA at the high school.
- No graduation requirements will be waived or changed for any students participating in the College Credit Plus Program, including the state mandated end of course exams.
- Under Option B, if a student fails a course, receives a Withdraw Fail, a Withdrawal after the deadline, or receives an Incomplete, the student is required to reimburse the school district for all expenses. The grade will be recorded on the high school transcript and factored into the cumulative GPA.
- Students must enroll in a minimum of 6 classes per semester (combined between the school and the college). Students who participate in athletics must meet with their high school counselor to ensure minimum credit requirements are being met.
- Those who wish to be considered "full-time" CCP students (thus not taking any classes at EHS), must take a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester.
- The students must bring a copy of the college class schedule to his/her high school counselor for high school schedules adjustments. anytime a student drops/adds CCP classes, they must notify the high school counselor.
- The responsibility for contacting the college, applying, and meeting all deadlines rests with the student.
