Community Update and Elmwood Tidbits:

It is a great time of the year. School is settling in and the students are really doing well with our “new normal”. They are tolerating the mask wearing, and overall do not complain. I know they are just happy to be back, and will do what it takes to stay in session.

So far, we have only had one positive COVID case in our halls. Each time we have a staff or student get a confirmed positive result, we will send the very same email to everyone on our email list. Please understand that we are not allowed to disclose any more information than what was in the letter, and therefore, other than the date, the same letter will be used for each positive case. On our website, we do keep track of those quarantined also. If a student or staff is in isolation, this means they have a confirmed diagnosis. To be in quarantine means that we are sending a staff or student home for 14 days due to exposure to a positive patient either here at school or in the community. While we are only required to tell the number of isolations, we are trying to be transparent and give the full picture of what is happening in our district. A few weeks ago, we announced that we are able to offer every child a free breakfast and a free lunch through a federal program from now until the end of December (or until federal funds run out). This announcement has been well received as we are seeing our breakfast numbers increase threefold, and our lunch counts have doubled. The District is excited to offer this wonderful benefit and encourage all students to take advantage of these free meals while they can.

Wood County recently added Dolly Parton’s Imagination Library. This program is free and sends your child a free book each month of their lives from birth to age five. See the two flyers at the end of my newsletter for more information on the program, and on how to sign up your children.

Elmwood Robotics Club Receives Grant: The Elmwood Robotics Club has received a grant for \$5,000 from the TC Energy Foundation to help expand their club and purchase new supplies. The club has grown its membership from a handful of students in 2013 to almost 20 in recent years. The students in the club are challenged with a game each school year and have to design, build, and program the robot to compete against other robots from around Ohio. This school year the team will be competing in the VEX Robotics Competition “Change Up” where they will have to grab colored spheres and score them in cylindrical goals to outscore the team from the opposite alliance. The game is two minutes long and consists of a 15-second autonomous period where the robot operates on preprogrammed coding and the remainder of the time is driver controlled where a student will drive the robot with the aid of a spotter. Teams have a number of qualifying matches at each competition and end with a single elimination tournament. Teams that win the local competitions win a qualifying spot to the state championships, and could possibly move onto the national completion and a world completion. In years past Elmwood has only been able to enter one team per competition, but with the aid of this grant it will look at

entering multiple teams. The club would like to thank the TC Energy Foundation for their support in growing their club.

The robotics club is an extension of our Project Lead the Way (PLTW) classes. PLTW are academic classes that teach engineering career based skills. I am proud to announce that the National PLTW Organization recognized our PLTW program. The letter starts out: For the second year in a row, Elmwood Middle School has been recognized as a Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Distinguished School for providing broad access to transformative learning opportunities for students through PLTW Gateway. It is one of just 176 middle schools across the U.S. to receive this honor. PLTW is a nonprofit organization that serves millions of PreK-12 students and teachers in over 12,200 schools across the U.S. There are 270 PLTW Gateway middle school programs in the state of Ohio and Elmwood is one of only 18 schools to receive this recognition.

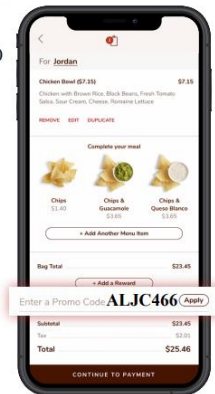

Prevalent Themes and Focus of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library: Inspiration & Imagination

Additional Fundamental Themes of Regard:

Love of reading and learning; regard for diversity of people, their roles, culture, and environment; promotion of self-esteem and confidence, appreciation of art and aesthetics

Year One: Birth to 12 Months

Vision - bright, big, colorful
Touch - board pages
Rhyme and rhythm
Simple - easy to use
Minimal text - point and say
Playful sound
Nurture - attachment, lullaby themes

Year Two: 13 Months to 24 Months

Continue concepts from year one and build upon them
Repetition and predictability - generate language
Books about daily routines, topics familiar to child
Use of real photo illustration
Body awareness
Nursery rhymes
Colors, letters, numbers

Year Three: 25 Months to 36 Months

Wordless books - build your own story (reader and child)
Values and character
Issues - fear, conflict, love, safety
Colors, letters, numbers
Nursery rhymes

Year Four: 37 Months to 48 Months

More complex stories - hero, complication, resolution
Diversity of others - faces, environments - OK to be different
Play, humor, fun
Nursery rhymes and poetry

Year Five: 49 Months to 60 Months

School preparation and readiness
Use rebus (pictures used for words)
Science - non-fiction
Folk tales
Thank you, appreciation
Rhymes and poetry
