Violations of the Student Code of Conduct/ Team Rules (Applies to all student athletes in grades 7-12)

- Student athletes should remain drug, alcohol, and tobacco free both in-season and out-of-season. Thus, student-athletes should not possess, transmit, conceal, consume, or show evidence of having consumed or used, or offer for sale, or attempt to purchase any alcoholic beverage, illegal drugs, tobacco, vaping devices, steroids, non-prescribed drugs, look alike drugs, or any mind altering substance, nor be associated with those who are. “Guilty by association” could be, but is not limited to the following: is A). Being present at a student gathering where alcohol or other drugs are being used by minors. To be given consideration when levying penalties, students must leave such a student gathering promptly. B). Being present at an establishment meant only for adults (bar, alcohol only type setting) without parents. C). Other similar issues as determined by the administration.

- For violations of the student Code of Conduct, as determined by the athletic director, principal or designee, the student athlete will be subject to the penalties related to the violation of the Student Handbook listed previously in this document. Athletes will not be allowed to participate in contests during the period of a suspension.

- Coaches may establish additional rules in their sports which have the approval of the athletic director and principal. These rules must be in written form and in agreement with the athletic and student handbook. These additional rules must be signed by the athlete and his/her parent or guardian.

- An athlete will not engage in criminal activity or violations of civil and criminal law. Recognizing the varying degree of severity of violations (misdemeanors vs. felonies), consequences for involvement could range from the consequences described in the code of conduct to denial of participation. Consultation between the coach, athletic director and the principal will take place before the denial of participation. Any student athlete in attendance at a site where illegal activity is taking place must leave that site immediately. Failure to do so will result in a violation of the athletic code of conduct and the athlete will be assessed the corresponding consequence per this document. Illegal substance violations will be treated the same as a failed drug test. In addition, any student attempting to assist another in falsifying a drug test will be subject to a violation. Students prohibited from participation in all or part of any extra-curricular activity are not entitled to further notice, hearing, or appeal rights.

Pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code 3313.843 and 3313.845, the Wood County Educational Service Center (WCESC), as Fiscal Agent, and the Board of Education of the Elmwood Local School District (District), agree this _____ day of _____, 2023 to the following contractual terms:

Section 1.

Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in Sections 2-9, the WCESC agrees to provide services authorized by the Ohio Revised Code and requested by the District through this contract, as selected by the district in Section 2 below, for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024.

Section 2.

The District elects to participate in the following programs and receive any services associated with those programs as detailed below. Additional services not checked (x) can be added as agreed upon between the District and the WCESC.

Section 3.

The WCESC reserves the right to cancel any one or all of the services and programs listed in Section 2 of this Agreement if an insufficient number of districts elect to participate in a particular program or if there is a discontinuation or reduction of funds. Notice of such cancellation will be provided to the District by the WCESC.

Section 4.

In consideration of the services and programs contracted for above, the District agrees to pay for any programs or services in which it has elected to participate, and the pro-rata share of any unemployment benefits which may become payable due to cancellation of any services or programs.

Section 5.

The District further agrees to pay the WCESC for any and all programs or services in which it has elected to participate. The District agrees to assume and pay all expenses including, but not limited to, any and all salary and fringe benefits (such as unemployment, health care insurance, severance, liability insurance, workers' compensation) for individuals contracted by the District from the WCESC.

Section 6.

The District agrees to pay the WCESC an agency fee of 4.5% for any and all services rendered.

Section 7.

The District, in consideration of the Agreement with the WCESC to provide services and programs contracted for above, agrees to provide written notice to the WCESC of its desire to withdraw from participation in any one or more of the programs and services contracted for above no later than December 31, 2023. Such withdrawal notice, if received by WCESC on or before December 31, 2023, shall operate to eliminate, for the succeeding school year, all contractual obligations of the parties with respect to the programs or services, which are included in the notice of withdrawal.

Section 8.

All invoices for the programs and services contracted herein by the WCESC shall be due and payable not more than thirty (30) days from the date of mailing of the invoice by WCESC.

Section 9.

With regard to any therapy services provided by the WCESC pursuant to this Agreement, the WCESC (1) will comply with the requirement of 45 CFR 164.504(e)(1) for safeguarding and limiting access to information concerning beneficiaries; (2) will allow the representatives of the U.S. Department of Human Services, ODM, ODE or their respective designee access to the subcontractor's books, documents and records; and (3) acknowledges that they or their principles are not suspended or debarred.

Terms of Agreement:

In consideration of their mutual promises continued herein, and for the other goods and valuable consideration, it is hereby agreed as follows:

Elmwood Local Board of Education (District) and Wood County Educational Service Center (WCESC) state that they will comply with all rules and regulations of the Americans with Disabilities Act and agree by signing this agreement that each shall conform and comply with said regulations related to this agreement.

The District and WCESC agree that as a condition of this contract, there shall be no discrimination against any employee, agent, or sub-contractor because of race, color, sex, religion, national origin, handicap, or any other factor as specified in Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and subsequent amendments. It is further agreed that the District and WCESC will comply with all appropriate federal and state laws regarding such discrimination and the right to and method of appeal shall be made available to all persons under this contract. Any agency found out of compliance with this paragraph may be subject to termination of this contract.

The WCESC agrees to ensure that any agent, including a subcontractor to whom it provides Protected Health Information received from or created or received by WCESC on behalf of the District, agrees to the same restrictions and conditions that apply through this contract to the WCESC with respect to such information.

Except as otherwise limited in this contract, the WCESC may use or disclose Protected Health Information to perform functions, activities, or services for, or on behalf of, the District, provided that such use or disclosure would not violate the Privacy Rule if done by the District or the minimum necessary policies and procedures of the District.

The District hereby agrees, in return for such services provided, as set forth in this contract to assume the following costs as outlined herein:
